

On-street parking is changing



This month, you will see new parking signs and 'pay by plate' parking machines installed within the area from Edinburgh Street to Newton Road. Until they are ready for use, the signs and parking machines will be kept covered. From late November, paid parking will replace time-restricted and unrestricted parking.



Paid parking hours of operation and charges

	0-2 hours	2+ hours
Monday to Friday 8am-6pm	\$3 per hour	\$6 per hour
Saturday, 8am-6pm	\$1 per hour	
Sunday and public holidays	Free	

A 10-minute grace period allows for pick-ups and drop-offs without needing to pay.

Why are we making the change to paid parking?

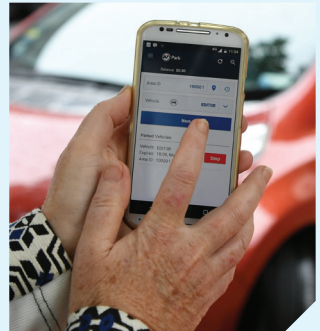
In March, we shared with the community our proposed changes to parking within the Karangahape Road precinct. People told us they wanted to see more parking opportunities for those visiting the area.

- Paid parking improves the availability of car parks through a higher turnover of parking spaces.
- Paid parking offers greater flexibility in the length of stay and includes a 10-minute grace period, allowing for pick-ups and drops-offs.
- A graduated pricing structure encourages short-stay parking and discourages commuter parking.

AT Park – parking made easy

The AT Park app can be downloaded for use on Android and Apple mobile devices. You will need to register through the mobile app or via AT's website.

Once you have registered, start your parking session by entering the Area ID of where you are parked and your vehicle registration number. At the end of your parking session, press the "Stop" function found in the app.

- Only pay for the time you use
- Get a text reminder when your parking is due to expire
- Easy-to-use map with parking locations and prices
- No transaction fees.
